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"Report on Exemplary Community Service at Surana College, Peenya – Academic Year 2023-24"

Surana College, Peenya, has integrated Exemplary Community Service (ECS) into its mission, adopting villages in Nanjangud Taluk to address pressing community needs. Through initiatives in education, healthcare, environmental conservation, and financial assistance, the college has empowered villagers, fostering sustainable growth. Key efforts have included establishing a learning center, organizing health camps, and facilitating access to government schemes.

Continuing these efforts, on May 29, 2024, NSS volunteers hosted a free eye checkup camp in Gundlupete in partnership with Aravind Hospitals, offering essential eye screenings to residents. Forty-two volunteers participated, significantly impacting the community's well-being.

Additionally, an NSS camp held from October 15-21, 2023, in Gangonahalli Village centered on community engagement, personal growth, and cultural activities. Volunteers contributed to village sanitation, beautification projects, and cultural performances, strengthening bonds with villagers and enhancing their service spirit. Notable guests, including local leaders, praised the students' dedication to social responsibility.

These initiatives underscore Surana College's commitment to fostering empathy, social engagement, and community upliftment among students, preparing them to be proactive, compassionate citizens addressing local needs.

Overview:

The NSS Camp, held from October 15 to October 21, 2023, in Gangonahalli Village, Thippasandra Hobli, Magadi Taluk, was a resounding success. Organized by the NSS committee, the camp aimed to foster community engagement, cultural enrichment, and personal growth among the participating NSS students.

Day 1 - October 15, 2023: Journey and Camp Setup.

At 8:30 am on the inaugural day, NSS volunteers convened near the college, ready for a week of service. Efficiently, they gathered essential equipment from the NSS room, loading it onto the bus by 10:30 am. The journey began, punctuated by a short stop at Kudhur at 12:30 pm for additional supplies.

The cultural team, fueled by the volunteers' enthusiasm, organized games for the small children, distributed small gifts, and concluded the event by 9:30 pm. The cultural performances left an indelible mark, and to add a touch of joy, a small dance for the children was organized. 
